Message from our Pastor 

The Gospels tell us that Jesus appeared to the disciples on several occasions after they discovered that his tomb was empty. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit but in bodily form. The bodily form was not one that the disciples recognized though. In John's Gospel, Mary of Mandala does not recognize that the figure standing before her is Jesus until he speaks to her. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples who meet Jesus on the road to Emmaus do not recognize him until he breaks bread with them. The resurrected Jesus had a physical presence, but the disciples couldn't recognize Jesus unless he allowed them to. His resurrected body, nonetheless, showed the marks of his crucifixion.

From readings such as today's Gospel, we also see that in his resurrected body, Jesus seems to be free of physical constraints. He appears to the disciples despite the fact that the doors were locked.

Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, Jesus commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." During the meeting, Jesus also shows the integral connection between forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

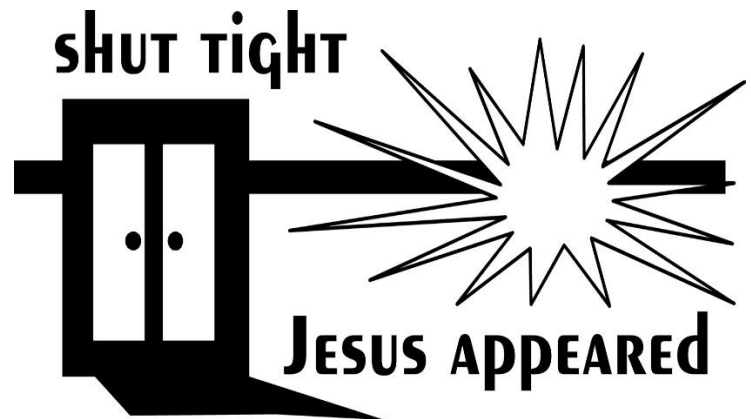
The story of Thomas illustrates our Christian experience today: We are called to believe without seeing. In fact, all Christians after the first witnesses have been called to believe without seeing. Thomas's doubt is hardly surprising; the news of Jesus' appearance was incredible to the disciples who had seen him crucified and buried. Thomas's human nature compelled him to want hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death was indeed the same Jesus who had been crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to act on that desire. He is our witness that Jesus is really risen.

Our faith is based on the witness of the Church that has preceded us, beginning with Thomas and the first disciples. Through Baptism we receive the same Holy Spirit that Jesus brought to the first

disciples. We are among those who are "blessed" because we believe without having seen.

La Cruz de Jesucristo, fue un verdadero escándalo para los discípulos; la Cruz no tenía nada de glorioso, al contrario: un tormento en el cual el Señor sufrió una pasión dolorosísima, una muerte humillante... y la sepultura pareció ser un verdadero fin a todo esto. Tomás, el apóstol, no estaba cuando Jesús se apareció por primera vez y los apóstoles le anuncian la feliz noticia; hemos visto al Señor, pero Tomás duda de sus condiscípulos y del mismo Señor y se empecina en esta postura tan común entre nosotros: si no veo, no creo.

No miremos a Tomás como a un extraño: muchas actitudes nuestras nos hacen parecidos a él: nuestras incredulidades, desconfianzas, temores, dudas, nuestros peros ante Dios... ya que somos muchas veces cristianos con peros (soy cristiano pero acepto el divorcio, o tenemos miedo al testimonio, pensando que la mentira tiene derechos) estas actitudes entre otras que podríamos resumir como nuestras negativas frente a ciertas exigencias de la fe, le quitan a la misma pureza, fuerza y alegría; inmersos en muchos problemas, más de una vez

corremos el riesgo de pensar que viendo a Jesús como lo vieron sus contemporáneos sería más fácil para nosotros creer, tener fe; nuestras actitudes en los momentos de prueba destapan muchas veces nuestra falta de fe; exigimos de Dios respuesta inmediata y solución a nuestros problemas: y le preguntamos y lo acosamos: ¿por qué el hambre? ¿por qué la guerra, la violencia, el aborto, la injusticia, el negociado? ¿por qué al malo parece que todo le va bien y al que quiere hacer las cosas bien parece que todo se le hace más difícil? ¿por qué a veces las cosas parecen complicarse sin remedio, por qué aparece el cáncer, la enfermedad, el dolor, la tristeza, la soledad, la muerte, POR QUÉ?

¿Es posible vivir esto, y seguir creyendo que Cristo resucitó? ¿Que la muerte está vencida? Que hay Vida Nueva, un Nueva Creación?

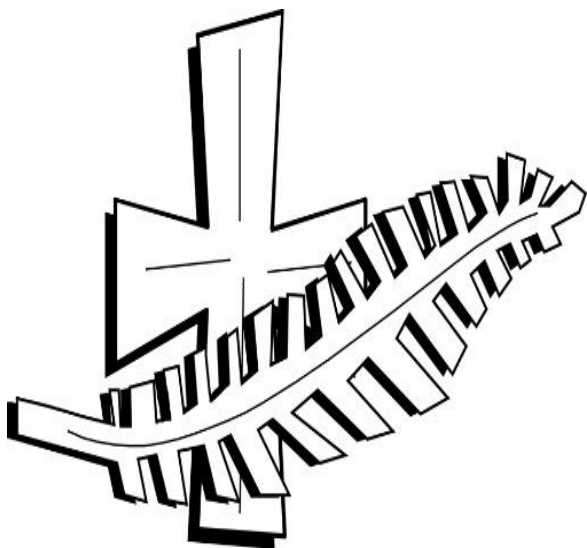
