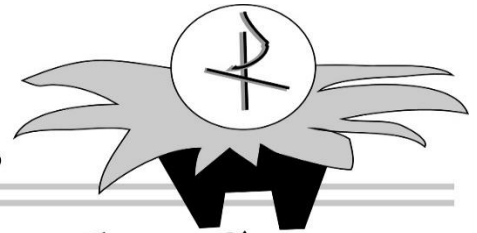

**Message from our Pastor** 

We have come to the end of Advent and there is little time left to shop for Christmas. So, people are checking their list and checking it twice to be sure that they do not miss anyone. Now they will spend a lot of time, energy and worry pacing up and down the malls, reading the ads in the paper and surfing the internet to get just the right gift for each person on their list. When Christmas comes, they will be exhausted.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if there was one gift that was perfect for everyone, one gift that fits all? Well, thanks be to God there is. There is a gift that fits all. It is not something you can put under the tree. It is not something you can buy from Macy's or Neiman Marcus. It is priceless. It is the gift that God gave you. It is you, yes you, the unique, unrepeatable, indispensable you. The gift that fits all is the gift of self.

The gift of self is what Christmas is all about. John tells us, "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God...And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us..." (John 1: 1-14) Paul puts it this way, "...though he was in the form of God, he did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather he emptied himself taking the form of a slave coming in human likeness...he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." (Phil. 2: 6-8) The gift of self is also what our daily Christmas, the Eucharist, is all about. "Take and eat; this is my body...Drink from it all of you, for this is my blood..." (Matt. 26: 26-28)

How foolish it is to think that Christmas could be anything less than the giving of self, of our love, our peace, our joy! But each year the world tries to change Christmas into a purely commercialized, secular celebration. More and more each year, it exploits Christmas as a marketing strategy which officially begins with Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade broadcast nationally in front of the Macy's Department Store. The last float in the parade features Santa Clause ushering in the biggest shopping season of the year. The purpose, of course, is to



engulf us in a sea of consumerism, consumerism that is disguised as gift-giving; gift-giving that is used as a substitute for the genuine gift of self.

But wait a minute! Check the list again! We have forgotten someone! Whose birthday are we celebrating anyway? What about the gift for Him? Isn't it amazing! We are celebrating the birthday of Jesus and we give gifts to everyone else! We are guilty of the very thing we warned others about: "Keep the Christ in Christmas," "Jesus is the reason for the season." But what gift could we possibly give? What gift would Jesus want? The only gift Jesus wants is the gift He has given us on the first Christmas, the gift he gives us daily in the Eucharist, the gift of self, the one gift that fits all.

**"Take and receive, O Lord, all my memory, my understanding and my whole will. You have given me all that I am and all that I possess; I surrender it all to you that you may dispose of it according to your will. Give me only your love and your grace; with these I, will be rich enough and will desire no more."**

Si quisiéramos exponer en una palabra la síntesis de la liturgia de la Palabra de este cuarto domingo de adviento podríamos decir: "Emmanuel: que significa Dios con nosotros". Este domingo es una especie de vigilia litúrgica de la Navidad. En él se anuncia la llegada inminente del Hijo de Dios. Se subraya que este niño que nacerá en Belén es el prometido por las Escrituras y constituye la plena realización de la Alianza entre Dios y los hombres. La primera lectura (1L) expone el oráculo del profeta Isaías. El rey Asaz desea aliarse con el rey de Asiria para defenderse de las acechanzas de sus vecinos (rey de Damasco y rey de Samaria). Isaías se opone a cualquier alianza que no sea la alianza de Yahvé. Lo que el profeta propone al rey es una respuesta de fe y de confianza total en la providencia de Dios, verdadero rey de Jerusalén. El

rey Asaz debía confiar en el Señor y no aliarse con ningún otro rey. Sin embargo, el rey Asaz ve las cosas desde un punto de vista terreno y naturalista: desea aliarse con el más fuerte, el rey de Asiria. Isaías sale a su encuentro y lo apremia: "pide un signo y Dios te lo dará. Ten confianza en Él". Sin embargo, el rey Asaz teme abandonarse en las manos de Dios y se excusa diciendo: "no pido ningún signo". En su interior había decidido la alianza con los hombres despreciando el precepto de Dios. Isaías se molesta y le ofrece el signo: "la Virgen está encinta y da a luz un hijo y le pone por nombre Emmanuel, es decir, Dios con nosotros". La tradición cristiana ha visto en este oráculo un anuncio del nacimiento de Cristo de una virgen llamada María (EV). Así lo interpreta el Evangelio de Mateo cuando considera la concepción virginal y del nacimiento de Cristo: María esperaba un hijo por obra del Espíritu Santo. Esta fe en Cristo se recoge admirablemente en el exordio de la carta a los romanos. San Pablo ofrece una admirable confesión de fe en Cristo Señor. Nacido según lo humano de la estirpe de David; constituido, según el Espíritu Santo, Hijo de Dios (2L). Pablo subraya el origen divino del Mesías y, al mismo tiempo, su naturaleza humana como "nacido de la estirpe de David". Verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre.
